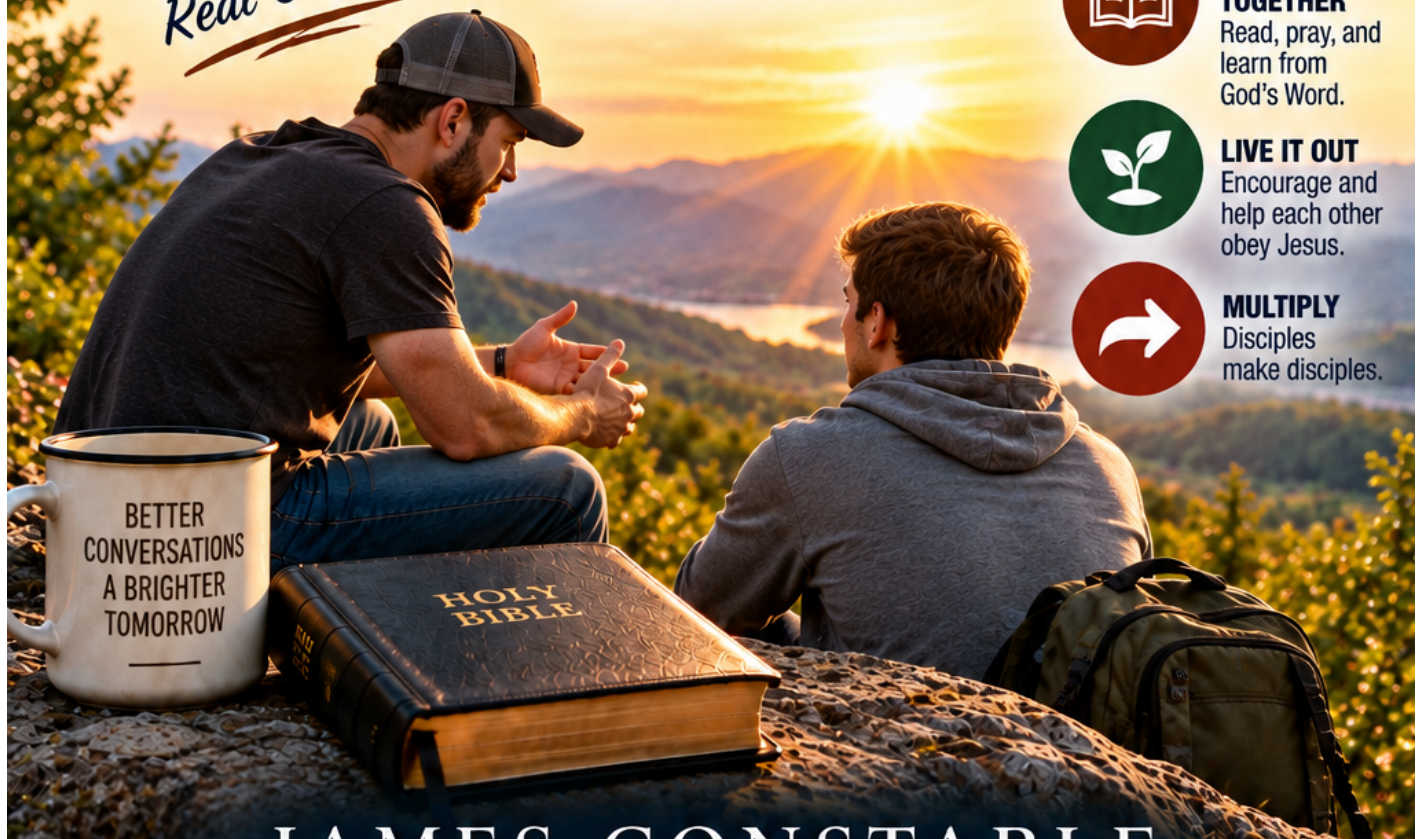

You Don't Need a Crowd to Make Disciples

You do not need a large church, a big class, or a crowd of people to make disciples.

You only need someone willing to follow Jesus with you.

Jesus spoke to crowds, but He spent much of His time with a small group of disciples. He taught them, prayed with them, answered their questions, and showed them how to live. Then He sent them out to help others follow Him.

Jesus showed us that disciple-making can begin small.

Jesus Started With a Few

Jesus could have spent all His time speaking to thousands. Instead, He chose twelve men to walk closely with Him.

Mark 3:14 (NKJV) says: "Then He appointed twelve, that they might be with Him and that He might send them out to preach."

Notice what came first.

They were called to be with Jesus.

Before they were sent out, they spent time with Him. They watched how He lived. They heard His teaching. They saw how He loved people. They learned from His example.

Biblical discipleship begins the same way today. We spend time with Jesus, learn His Word, and then help someone else do the same.

Start With One Person

Sometimes we think making disciples must be a large ministry. It does not.

Start with one person.

Invite someone to read the Bible with you. Pray together. Talk about what God is teaching you. Ask how you can help each other obey Jesus.

You do not have to know every answer.

You simply need to be willing to walk beside someone as both of you grow.

Paul gave Timothy this pattern: "And the things that you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." - 2 Timothy 2:2 (NKJV)

Look at the pattern. Paul taught Timothy. Timothy taught faithful people. Those people taught others. That is multiplication.

Disciples Make Disciples

Jesus did not tell us only to attend church or learn more about the Bible. He gave His followers a mission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations." - Matthew 28:19 (NKJV)

Every follower of Jesus can be part of this mission.

You may begin with your spouse, a friend, a coworker, a neighbor, or someone at church. Meet for coffee. Open the Bible. Pray together. Talk about following Jesus in everyday life.

One person can help another person grow. That person can eventually help someone else. A small beginning can have a lasting impact.

Your Next Step

Do not wait for a crowd.

Ask God to show you one person you can encourage and help grow as a follower of Jesus. Then take one simple step.

Send a message. Make a phone call. Invite them to meet. Open God's Word together.

Disciple-making does not have to begin on a stage. It can begin with two people, an open Bible, and a desire to follow Jesus together.

Who is one person God may be placing in your life for you to disciple?
